## D-Day 80 at the Royal Albert Hall Hosted by Davina McCall

On Thursday 6 June 2024, the Royal Albert Hall will host an anniversary event marking D-Day 80. On Sunday 9 June the show will be broadcast on ITV and ITVX, bringing to a close the national commemorations.
