Some Voices (2000)

During Napoleon's exile on St. Helena, some loyalists hire a look-alike to swap places with the deposed Emperor. While the impostor lives in luxury on the island, the real Napoleon returns to Paris in order to retake the throne. Starring lan Holme.

Wish You Were Here (1987)

In a staid English seaside town after the Second World War, young Lynda grows up with her widowed father and younger sister. She eventually becomes pregnant by an acquaintance of her father. Starring Emily Lloyd and Tom Bell.

Leon The Pig Farmer (1992)

An irreverent comedy is set in motion when Leon Geller, a sensitive Jewish man from London, learns that he is the product of an artificial insemination accident, and that his real father is a farmer from Yorkshire. Starring Mark Frankel and Janet Suzman.

Route Irish (2010)

The story of a private security contractor in Iraq who rejected the official explanation of his friend's death and sets out to discover the truth. Starring John Bishop, Mark Womack and Andrea Lowe.

4th November

Red Riding: The Year Of Our Lord 1974 (2009) - Exclusive

A rookie Yorkshire journalist sets out to solve the case of a child murderer. Starring Andrew Garfield, Sean Bean and Rebecca Hall.

Red Riding: The Year Of Our Lord 1980 (2009) - Exclusive

A team of investigators attempt to stop a serial killer known as the Yorkshire Ripper from claiming his next victim, but uncover something far more terrifying. Starring Paddy Considine, Warren Clarke and Sean Harris.

Red Riding: The Year Of Our Lord 1983 (2009) - Exclusive

Plagued by guilt, a corrupt police official attempts to solve the case of a missing schoolgirl after seeing connections between her disappearance and a rash of prior abductions. Starring Mark Addy, David Morrissey and Jim Carter.

Life S1 (2020)

Gail, Belle, David, and Hannah all encounter new and disruptive influences in their lives, kicking off interweaving stories set in a house in Manchester, England, divided into four flats. Starring Peter Davison, Victoria Hamilton, Saira Choudhry and Alison Steadman.

The Field of Blood S1-2 (2011-2013)

Adaptation of Denise Mina's novel set in 1982. When the story of a murder involves her family, newspaper copy boy Paddy Meehan must battle prejudices to get to the truth. Starring David Morrissey, Peter Capaldi and Jayd Johnson.

This Time with Alan Partridge S1 (2019)

Alan is handed a career lifeline - the chance to stand in as co-host on This Time, a weekday magazine show. But can he capitalise on the opportunity?

Knowing Me, Knowing You with Alan Partridge S1 (1994)

Alan Partridge hosts his own chat show on the BBC. He insults and belittles almost all of his guests and is humiliated by the rest.

11th November

Roadkill (2020)

Politician Peter Laurence's (Hugh Laurie) private life is falling apart. Shamelessly untroubled by guilt or remorse, he seeks to further his own agenda whilst others plot to bring him down. Can he out-run his own secrets to win the ultimate prize?

Single-Handed S1-2 (2007-2008)

Jack Driscoll moves back to the town on the west coast of Ireland where he was born. He takes over his retired father's Garda post, and solves different cases. Starring Owen McDonnell.

They Shall Not Grow Old (2018)

Acclaimed documentary by Peter Jackson with never-before-seen footage to commemorate the centennial of the end of the First World War.

18th November

Rome S1-2 (2005-2007)

A down-to-earth account of the lives of both illustrious and ordinary Romans set in the last days of the Roman Republic. Starring Kevin McKidd and Ray Stevenson.

Personal Services (1987)

The story of the rise of a madame of a suburban brothel catering to older men, inspired by the real experiences of Cynthia Payne. Starring Julie Walters.

The Count Of Monte Cristo (1975)

A young officer, falsely imprisoned by his jealous "friends," escapes and uses a hidden treasure to exact his revenge. Starring Richard Chamberlain, Trevor Howard and Louis Jourdan.

The Plank (1967)

The slapstick perilous misadventures of two clumsy construction builders whom require a wooden floorboard. Starring Tommy Cooper and Eric Sykes.

Victim (1961)

Lawyer Melville Farr takes up the case of a worker who is blackmailed for being homosexual at the cost of derailing his promising career. Starring Dirk Bogarde and Sylvia Syms.

Too Many Crooks (1959)

In this spoof on crime films, four would-be criminals manage to botch every job they plan. When they try to rob wealthy Billy Gordon they fail again. But the gang decides to kidnap his daughter. Starring Terry-Thomas, George Cole and Brenda da Banzie.

Brief Encounter (1945)

Returning home from a shopping trip to a nearby town, bored suburban housewife Laura Jesson is thrown by happenstance into an acquaintance with virtuous doctor Alec Harvey. Their casual friendship soon develops, during their weekly visits, into something more emotional. Starring Celia Johnson and Trevor Howard.

25th November

Some Mothers Do 'Ave 'Em S1-3 (1973-1978)

Accident-prone Frank Spencer fails to navigate the simplest tasks of daily life, while also trying to look after his wife and baby.

New Tricks S3-5 (2006-2008)

Three retired police officers are drafted in to solve cold cases, with a touch of comedy and drama. Starring Dennis Waterman, Amanda Redman and Alun Armstrong.

The Game (2014)

Daddy, the head of MI5, assembles a secret team to investigate an alleged Soviet plot that could change the course of the Cold War. Miniseries starring Tom Hughes and Brian Cox.
