

A Year on Planet Earth Sunday, 8pm 16th July ITV1


Witness the incredible ways in which all life is connected by our journey around the sun in this breath-taking four-part nature series narrated by Stephen Fry.

The Hajj:
A Journey Through Mecca

Murder In The Family Thursday, 9pm 20th July ITV1

This true crime series investigates murders where the victim and perpetrator are family, telling stories of ordinary relationships that take extraordinary tragic turns.

This episode tells the story of Jennifer Cronin - who was burned alive by her son-in-law in 2018 in front of her daughter Susan - and explores the downward spiral of coercive control, domestic violence and drug abuse that led to her horrifyingly brutal death.









FIFA Women's World Cup 2023: Philippines v Switzerland Thursday, 5.50am 20th July ITV1

Coverage of the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup continues with the Philippines making their World Cup debut at the Dunedin Stadium against Switzerland.

The Philippine side will hope to carry over the fine form which saw them win the AFF Women's Championship in 2022 as Switzerland aim to better a disappointing Euro 2022 campaign - Pien Meulensteen and Siobhan Chamberlain are our commentators.
