Moneyball Saturday, 8pm 22nd July ITV1


Game show hosted by Ian Wright, where the difference between the contestants winning big and going home with nothing rests entirely on the bounce of a ball.

**Arc Racing League** Thursday, 5.15pm 27th July ITV4


Matt Chapman presents coverage as the 2023 Arc Racing League gets under way with seven regional teams lining up to take the start of the action at Yarmouth.
