


#### Letterkenny Series 7 Full series drop on ITVX on Thursday 11th January ITVX




The Masked Singer Saturday, 7pm 6th January ITV1




FA Cup Live: Wigan Athletic v Manchester United Monday, 7.30pm 8th January ITV1




Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix Sunday, 7.20pm 7th January ITV2




The Real Housewives of Cheshire: Pride Monday & Tuesday, 9pm 8th & 9th January ITVBe




Malpractice Monday-Friday, 11.05pm 8th-12th January ITV3
