Ukraine's War: The Other Side Monday, 10.45pm 19th February ITV1


A journey into Russia's heart of darkness, traveling inside Putin's war on Ukraine in occupied Donbas, the documentary takes a look at the human side of Russia's war.

Joanna Lumley's Home Sweet Home - Travels in My Own Land Sunday, 9pm **18th February** ITV3

After a lifetime of travels that have taken her across the globe, Joanna Lumley is making her most personal journey yet by travelling around the UK in this series.

Starting at Tilbury Docks in Essex, Joanna heads north and makes a nostalgic return to Coronation Street for a reunion with actor William Roache - whose character Ken Barlow proposed to Joanna's character Elaine - before finishing this part of her trip in Whitby.
