Ron the Cobblers chairman needs to please an important investor, but Graham needs to please his wife Christine as she is desperate for a night out - meanwhile, Alan is struggling to hide the fact that his dad is Graham Carr from his ruthless school bullies.









Glitter: The Popstar Paedophile Tuesday, 9pm 23rd April ITV1

This film explores the dual life of the iconic performer and predatory abuser Gary Glitter while documenting his global crimes and the failures to bring him to justice.

The programme looks into how Glitter used his charismatic onstage persona to cover up his predatory offstage behaviour - meaning that he was only brought to justice decades after lighting up the charts with a slew of catchy hits - and why his victims were ignored.



Professor T Wednesday, 9pm 24th April ITV1

Cerebral crime drama series following Professor Jasper Tempest, a genius Cambridge University criminologist with OCD who advises the police on their cases.

When the professor comes under suspicion after the murder at a criminology conference of his biggest rival and the man who replaced him at the university, Jasper must somehow prove his innocence if he wants to regain his reputation and his career.


The Twelve Thursday & Friday, 10.45pm 25th & 26th April ITV1
